The dancers adapted by becoming even more aware of the space, each other, and the movement, and gave a stellar performance like nothing was affecting them.

At the close of the performance, the audience of over 200 was thrilled to experience the excitement of high-quality, live jazz dance. These dancers strive to leave the audience refreshed, renewed, and inspired, and that they certainly did.
